Lotus Evija

Given that Lotus built its reputation on lightweight sports cars with comparatively low power outputs, a 2,000-horsepower electric hypercar costing almost £2 million is a bit of a departure. But the carbon fibre-tubbed Evija is simply extraordinary, delivering a 0-186mph sprint in under 10 seconds, and handling that is sublime as you'd expect from a Lotus. And it can theoretically recharge its battery in just 9 minutes.

It's just a shame that there will only ever be 33 of them built...

**Bentley Continental GT Speed**

A plug-in hybrid Bentley Continental sounds, on the face of it, like an odd fit. Yet the capacity to wait for up to 50 miles on electric power alone is ideal for those runs to town for the Fortnum and Mason hamper. When you're travelling further afield, the extra boost from the electric motor fills in the performance gaps left by the imperious twin-turbo V8. It's not light at 2.5 tons, but who wants a lightweight Bentley?

Maserati **GranCabrio Trofeo**

You might no longer be able to get a V8 in Maserati's sporty soft-top, but power in the GranCabrio Trofeo certainly comes with a decent pedigree – it's the Nettuno V6 from the Maserati MC20 supercar, albeit in slightly detuned form. Even so, it still offers 535bhp and a 0-62mph time of 3.6 seconds. So it's hardly tardy. And with a beautifully trimmed and luxurious interior, this is one seriously capable grand tourer.

As a swansong for its current supercar-in-estate-car-clothing, the Audi RS6 GT is a fitting way to say goodbye to the model. With a wild livery that harks back to Audi's race and rallying legends of the 80s, it's hard to miss out on the street – but then the wide-arched RS6 is hardly a shrinking violet. There's no extra power for the GT, but you do get goodies like manually adjustable coilover suspension and ceramic brakes.

It might look like a subtle evolution of the 720S, but the 750S is up to 30 per cent new compared with the older car. It's also 30kg lighter, 30bhp more powerful – and you can save a further 13.8kg with optional lightweight wheels. This is the sort of nerdy, obsessive attention to detail that sets these supercars from Woking apart from more flamboyant brands with more flamboyant attitudes from more exotic places.
